

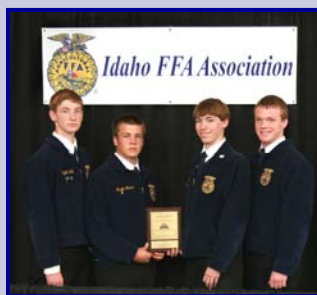
Idaho FFA Foundation Provides Support to Idaho FFA Programs

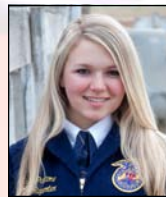

FFA has been an integral part of agriculture programs in Idaho high schools since 1928, currently with approximately 10,000 Idaho agricultural science & technology students, 85 active chartered Idaho FFA chapters, and 3,934 Idaho FFA members. There are 7,487 local FFA chapters with 523,309 members located throughout the United States, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

FFA has provided a formal structure for thousands of members over the years to acquire leadership and public speaking skills, and learn the importance of goal setting, the value of hard work, honesty and community service. Many of our current leaders in education, business, agriculture and government got their start in FFA.
